

BIOGRAPHIES

Gebhard Fugel

Lived from 1863 to 1939. Was a German painter who specialized on Christian motifs. (Modern Art)

Painted 136 paintings to the Bible, which were named *school wall paintings*. Painted these from 1908 to 1932. These were used as illustrations in school bibles and other books. Today the originals are in the diocesan's museum of Freising in Upper Bavaria, Germany.

Peter Paul Rubens

Lived from 1577 to 1640. Was a Flemish and European painter who was a proponent of an exuberant Baroque style that emphasized movement, color and sensuality. (Renaissance to Neoclassicism)

His Last Supper painting was painted in 1632 and is currently in Milan, Italy in the Brera Gallery.

Raymond Poulet

Was born in 1934 in Paris, France. Is a contemporary painter who has steadily had exhibits of his work across the world since the 1950s—34 in the 1980s, 34 in the 1990s and over 40 already in the 2000s. Is also a sculptor. His home is Paris, France. (Contemporary Art)

Pieter Pourbus

Lived from 1523 to 1584. Was a Dutch-born Flemish Renaissance painter. (Renaissance Art)

Was known primarily for his religious and portrait painting and worked mainly in Bruges, Belgium where he had moved from Gouda, West Netherlands by 1543. His son was the painter Frans Pourbus the Elder and his grandson was Frans Pourbus the younger.

His Last Supper painting was painted in 1548 and is currently in the Greninge Museum in Bruges, Belgium.

An art period is a phase in the development of the work of an artist, groups of artist or art movement.

Medieval Art 200 – 1430

Renaissance Art 1300 – 1602

Renaissance to Neoclassicism 1520 – 1830

Romanticism 1790 – 1880

Romanticism to Modern Art 1803 – 1870

Modern Art late 19th century – 1970

Contemporary Art 1960s – present

Under each of these art periods, there are sub phases that are grouped by the artists' style, country of inception and overall theme.
